

Drone Zone

Did you know? To fly a drone as a commercial pilot in the state of Florida (i.e. for work /business purposes) you are required to follow the requirements of the FAA's Part 107 Small UAS Rule (Part 107), which includes passing the FAA's Aeronautical Knowledge Test to obtain a Remote Pilot Certificate.

These regulations cover the following:

- Pilot qualifications and physiological factors
- Aircraft performance, maintenance, and inspections
- Maximum weight
- Maximum speed
- Maximum altitude
- Operations in and around controlled airspace
- Weather theory and services
- Airport operations
- Radio communications and charts
- Day and night time operations

Many who fly drones for fun are usually unaware of these regulations, but those that fly for business or professional reasons have the responsibility to become familiar with these regulations and continue to educate themselves on the ever-changing technology, laws, and regulations to ensure these aerial missions are conducted safely.

Back to School Safety

As summer draws to a close and children start heading back to school, family life can get pretty hectic. It's important to remember some key tips that will help keep everyone safe and healthy throughout the school year.


Driving Safety

- The first few weeks back to school means the roadways are extra busy so leave in plenty of time to travel.
- Be alert and watch for children especially near schools, bus stops, school buses and in school parking lots.
- Reduce or eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings. Put the phone down; no texting and driving.
- Buckle up! Make sure all passengers and drivers in a car, especially children, are buckled up. In Florida, passengers under 18 years of age must wear a seatbelt or be restrained in a child car seat.
- Pay extra attention to when you enter and exit a school zone.
- Watch for and obey signals from school crossing guards.

When a school bus stops and the red lights are flashing, traffic approaching from either direction is required to stop.

If you illegally pass a school bus on the road, here are some of the penalties you might face:

- ⇒ Moving violation subject to citation
- Requirement to complete a basic Driver Improvement Course
- ⇒ Four points on your driver license
- Minimum fine of \$165, if you pass on the side where children enter and exit, you will receive a minimum fine of \$265



Walking to school

- Walk on the sidewalk, if one is available; when on a street with no sidewalk, walk facing the traffic.
- Before you cross the street, stop and look left, right and left again to see if cars are coming.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing and always cross streets at crosswalks or intersections Stay alert and avoid distracted walking.

Riding a bicycle to school

- Ride on the right side of the road, with traffic, and in single file.
- Come to a complete stop before crossing the street; walk bikes across the street. Stay alert and avoid distracted riding.
- Make sure your child always wears a properly fitted helmet and bright clothing. Remember, helmets are required for all under 16 years of age.

Driving your child to school

- Stay alert and avoid distracted driving. Obey school zone speed limits and follow your school's drop-off procedure.
- Make eye contact with children who are crossing the street.

Preventing backpack-related injuries

- Choose a backpack for your child carefully; it should have ergonomically designed features to enhance safety and comfort.
- Ask your child to use both straps when wearing their backpack to evenly distribute the weight on their shoulders.
- Don't overstuff a backpack; it should weigh no more than 5 to 10 percent of your child's body weight.



Normal PSLF Requirements

Changes Until Oct. 31, 2022

LOAN TYPE

Receive credit only for Direct Loans

Receive credit for Direct, FFEL, or Perkins Loans

PAYMENT PLANS

Repayment under Standard Plan or IDR Plan

Past payments on any plan count for non-consolidation loans.

Past payments made on loans before consolidation count, even if on the wrong repayment plan.

PAYMENTS

Make on-time payments

Past payments that were made late or for less than the amount due count.

Past payments made on loans before consolidation count, even if paid late or for less than amount due.

UNCHANGED REQUIREMENTS

Make 120 payments or the equivalent

Be employed by government, 501(c)(3) not-for-profit, or other not-for-profit organization that provides a qualifying service

Have Direct Loans or consolidate into Direct Loans by October 31, 2022

Work full-time (30 hours/week minimum)
