- North Sumter County Utility Dependent District (NSCUDD) purchased Sumter Sanitation, LLC in December 2012.
- Sumter Sanitation services Marion County, Sumter County, and the Fruitland Park areas of The Villages.
- At the time of purchase, there were 39,700 residential and 200 commercial accounts. Today, Sumter Sanitation services approximately 53,667 residential and 296 commercial accounts.

- We utilize a “Waste-to-Energy” program that diverts waste from landfills to generate energy from the combustion of municipal solid waste. Waste-to-Energy facilities convert waste to power steam turbines which generate electricity for homes and businesses, reducing greenhouse gases and landfill waste. The resulting ash is processed to recover metal for recycling while all gases are collected, filtered and cleaned to minimize environmental impact.
- Waste-to-Energy is widely recognized as a technology that helps mitigate climate change. It is the only form of energy generation that actually reduces greenhouse gases and play an important role in addressing climate change due to avoiding methane from landfills, offsetting emissions from fossil fuel electrical production and recovering metals for recycling.

The Villages Waste-to-Energy Programs contributes to:

- Powering more than 1 million homes with reliable energy – 24 hours a day, seven days a week;
- Recovering more than 600,000 tons of metal each year for recycling, the equivalent amount of steel to build more than 450,000 automobiles;
- Eliminates transportation of solid waste to landfills including out of state landfills;
- Eliminates emissions from landfills, which are “super-emitters” of methane, a greenhouse gas that is 84 times more potent as a climate-warming gas than CO₂.
