

DISTRICT WEEKLY BULLETIN



- Never leave a grill or fire unattended; be mindful of the wind, and extinguish all fires completely.
- Do not grill indoors. Keep grills, bonfires, and fire pits away from low-hanging branches and materials that can easily catch fire.
- Keep a fire extinguisher nearby when using grills or fire pits.
- Cook all meat thoroughly, especially chicken, beef and pork.
- Keep perishables cool.
- Wear a properly fitting US Coast Guard-approved life jacket when on a boat.
- Avoid alcohol when swimming, boating or tubing.
- Designate an adult watcher/lifeguard to keep an eye on children in pools, rivers, at the beach or even in hot tubs.
- Never swim alone and try to stay within eyesight of a lifeguard station.
- Do not go swimming, tubing or boating after sunset.
- Wear SFP 15 or higher sunscreen, apply it 30 minutes before exposure and reapply every 2 hours.
- Use sunglasses and a hat to protect your eyes while celebrating outdoors.
- Stay hydrated and take breaks in the shade or indoors as often as possible.
- If you or a family member feels faint or nauseous, move to a cool place immediately and apply cold compresses to help lower body temperature.
- Always wear seat belts and make sure child car seats are properly installed.
- Have your car serviced before a long trip.
- Never drink and drive or allow yourself or anyone else to get into a car with someone who has been drinking.

By reducing Fats, Oils & Grease in Your Home and Community


FATS, OILS & GREASE (FOG) ARE A PROBLEM

Many food items contain fat, oil & grease (FOG) that can be harmful to your pipes and sewer system. Pouring FOG materials down your kitchen sink can result in dangerous sewage backups in your home and community. FOG materials include:

- Meat drippings
- Oil
- Butter
- Dressings
- Cooking fats

Within your home, FOG solidifies and can build up in your sewer pipes leading to potential blockages. While outside of your home, FOG can build up in the collection system and lift stations potentially causing odors and sewage overflows in our neighborhoods causing:

- Property damage
- Pipe maintenance requirements
- Health & environmental hazards due to overflows

Village Community Development Districts 1 – 11

If you live in the **Middleton Community Development District**, there will be no sanitation schedule change due to the holiday.

NWS HeatRisk



Overview

NWS HeatRisk is a color-numeric-based index that uses high-resolution weather, climate, and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) heat-health data to identify potentially dangerous heat.

It provides a daily value of expected heat risk for each 24-hour period within any upcoming 7-day forecast period.

HeatRisk Considerations

HeatRisk takes into consideration:

- . How unusual the heat is for the time of year
- Duration of the heat, including both daytime and nighttime temperatures
- If those temperatures pose an elevated risk of heat-related impacts based on CDC data

HeatRisk supplements the official NWS heat watch, warning, and advisory products.

Understanding HeatRisk

HeatRisk is divided into 5 categories and identifies the following:


- The groups potentially most at risk
- How common the heat is
- For those at risk, what actions can be taken

Each HeatRisk level is also accompanied by recommendations for heat protection. It is especially useful for decision makers and heat-sensitive populations who may need to take actions below current NWS heat product levels.
